Initial Coin Offering (ICO) explained:

Like an initial public offering (IPO) of stock from which its name is derived, an ICO is a way that cryptocurrency startups - and even established manufacturing companies - can raise money.


In an ICO, a quantity of the crowdfunded cryptocurrency is preallocated to investors in the form of "tokens" in exchange for traditional money or cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin or Ethereum. These tokens will become tradeable when the ICO's funding goal is met and the project launches.

The total amount of funds raised via ICOs in 2017 was nearly US\$4 billion.
